County Court Proceedings

Wednesday, Feb. 5, 1913, 9th Ju-
dicial day.

Court came pursuant to adjourn-
ment.

Officers all present.

Due proclamation being made, the
following proceedings were had:

Matter of the petition of J. M.
Nation et al for a county road:

On this 5th day of February,
1913, comes on for hearing the peti-
tion of J. M. Nation and 35 others,
freeholders, residing in the road
district or districts of said proposed
road, praying for the re-survey and
re-location of a county road de-
scribed as follows:

Beginning at the quarter post on
the north side of section 29, T7, N.
R. 3' W. of Willamette Meridian,
Columbia county, Oregon, thence in
a westerly direction on the most
practical route to, the section cor-
ner on township line between sec-
tions 30 and 19, T 7, N R 3 W and
Secs. 25 and 24, T 7, N R 4 W of
Willamette Meridian.

And it satisfactorily appearing to
the court from proof filed herein,
that due notice of the pendency of
this proceeding has been given as
by law required, that 12 of said
petitioners are legal freeholders of
this county, residing in the road
district or districts of the proposed
road, and that a good and sufficient
bond has been given and filed here-
in.

It is therefore ordered by the
court that the board of county road
viewers meet at Clatskanie on the
12th day of February, 1913, or on
their failure to meet on said day,
then within five days thereafter, and
proceed to view, survey and locate
said proposed road.

Matter of scalp bounty claims:

On this day the clerk presents to
the court the verified claim of W.
R. Holmes for \$2 for one wildcat,
being claim No. 53, and the court
being advised in the matter it is
ordered by the court that said claim
be and the same is hereby ap-
proved.

Matter of aid to Mrs. E. Spence:

On this day it is ordered by the
court that the clerk be and he is
hereby authorized to issue a general
fund warrant in the sum of \$25 in
favor of Mrs. E. Spence. It is
further ordered by the court that
the clerk issue a like warrant in the

official papers:

appearing to the court from the ex-
amination of said lists that the
Rainier Review and the Oregon
Mist are the two papers having the
largest number of bonafide yearly
subscribers receiving their papers
within the county, and not more
than one year in arrears in payment
for subscription. It is therefore
ordered by the court that the said
Rainier Review and Oregon Mist be
and they are hereby designated as
county official papers for the en-
suing year.

It is further ordered by the court
that the compensation for each of
the official newspapers for publish-
ing list of claims and such other
proceedings as are by law required
to be published be and the same is
hereby fixed at 2 1-2 cents per line,
brevier type, or its equivalent,
newspaper measure.

Matter of bids for special road
work in road district No. 3.

On this day bids for special im-
provement of roads in road district
No. 3, as advertised for, were
opened and examined by the court,
being as follows: U. S. DSpain and
Elon Felton, St. Helens-Portland
road, as per plans and specifications
for \$742.50. U. S. DSpain and
Elon Felton, Billat DSpain's place
for \$750. And the court being ad-
vised in the matter it is ordered by
the court that said bids be and the
same are hereby rejected.

It is further ordered by the court
that all special road work in said
road district No. 3 be performed
under supervision of the court.

Matter of purchase of car load of
powder.

the court to Columbia River Powder
Co. for the purchase of powder, to
be used exclusively for county work,
being 15,000 lbs Dupont stumping
at \$8.50 per hundred lbs, and 5000
lbs Dupont L. F. 40 per cent at
\$11.25 per hundred lbs.
