NFL offers grants to high schools

Athletic trainers provide much-needed help to high schools across the country, but not every school has the resources to have a trainer on site. In an effort to fix that, the NFL is

In an effort to fix that, the NFL is teaming up with the National Athletic Trainer Association, the Korey Stringer Institute, Professional Football Athletic Trainers Association and Gatorade to award as many as 150 grants to eligible schools in four states, including Oregon.

Each of the grants will be worth \$35,000 over a three-year period to help fund an athletic trainer program at the selected school.

The program is designed to help public high schools with football programs that have little or no access to an athletic trainer.

In the Mid-Valley, 14 schools would qualify and could apply for the grant.

"This is the first I've heard of it, but we would definitely be interested," said Kevin Moffatt, athletic director at Kennedy High School. "In the past, we happened to be lucky because a science teacher was certified. But right now we don't have one, and we would definitely be interested."

Moffatt said it would be such a valuable addition to have a dedicated athletic trainer on campus.

"It would be great for prevention," Moffatt said. "And it would be nice for concussion management."

The other pilot states involved in the program are Arizona, Illinois and Oklahoma.

"The NFL is committed to enhancing the safety of football at all levels," NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell said in a released statement about the program. "We are proud of the important work
