# INDIAN LANDS LEASED

## A Long Winded Affair Requiring Much Red Tape.

Pendleton Ore, Dec. 5—Preparations re being made by the leasing clerk stationed at the Umatilla Indian agency east of town to make new leases for every piece of leaseable ground on the reservation. The stipendousness of the task can only be realized when it is known that three copies of the leases must be made and as they are so long but three to 10 can be made a day. The work could be completed in a much shorter time if the bargains between the Indians and the lessors were complete, but they frequently wait until the clerk's office is reached before they commence.

Seven hundred and seventy five leases must be made, as heretofore they have been made in all shapes without the government's supervision.

All of the leaseable land is spoken for and in cases where there is more than one bidder for it sealed bids are issued and the highest bidder secures the prize.

### Postoffice Robbed

Robbers blew open the safe of the Hood River postoffice early Sunday morning, secured \$227 in stamps and \$173 in money, and made good their escape. Entrance to the building was effected by a crowbar and other tools taken from the railroad shops nearby, where a large gang of Italians and Japs is employed in construction work.

Postal inspectors are working on the case.
