MANY INDICTED FOR WAGE CONSPIRACY

Mineworkers Officials Accused of Part in Restricting Coal Competition.

Charleston, W. Va-President White and 18 other officials of the United Mine Workers of America, were indicted in the federal court here on a charge of violating the Sherman anti trust law. It is alleged the defendants conspired with the coal operators of western Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana and Illinois to raise wages in the West Virginia coal fields so as to prevent its competition with the other four states in the western market.

The indictments charged that the 19 men affiliated with the United Mineworkers of America did in Kanawha county, West Birginia, and within the jurisdiction of the federal district court, engage in a combination and conspiracy unlawfully in restraint of trade and commerce in the several states; the offense is said to have started September 1, 1912, and continued since.

It is charged that the indicted men have been agents and members of "an unincorporated voluntary organization of individuals as a labor union known as the United Mineworkers of America, having many thousands of members, who conspired, by regulating wages, to control the price at which the coal mined in the state of West Virginia could compete with coal mined in Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana and


