\$115,000,000 of Agricultural Products - Louis Hill Visits Portland

Portland, Ore., Oct. 15. (Special)-Oregon's agricultural products this year will amount to no less than \$115,-000,000, according to the estimate of business trip to Seattle and North Yak- Dr. James Withcombe, director of the government experiment station at Corvallis.
