



DEEP PLOWING **ALWAYS ADVISED**

Speaking only in general terms, it is safe to advine deep plowing as a rule. Deep plowing will entertain considerable rainfall without any runoff, and if thoroughly compacted at time of plowing and the surface broken up whenever feasible, should a downpoor of rain cament the soil particles together and form a crust, it will, to a great catent, prevent evaporation.
