HOW TO MAKE MONEY FROM YOUR CHICKENS

Why many poultry houses fail to meet the requirements for protection to egg producers, and the main point which should be observed in building hen houses, are told by Prof. James Dryden in one of his circular bulletins.

"The purpose of housing fowls is to increase productiveness," says Prof. Dryden. "A little shelter from the cold winds and storms will add to the comfort of the fowls and therefore to the egg yield, and the reason is probably because the change means a sudden demand for increased fuel or food to keep up the heat of the body, and the food that has been going into the making of eggs will be drawn upon for that purpose."

WHAT ALFALFA GIVES TO THE SOIL
