Remedies For Waste and Other Vital Phases of Rancher's Problems Presented by College Man

Oregon Agricultural College, May 27—That newspaper advertising for the sale of farm commodities is coming into use rapidly because it is one remedy for the wasteful and unsatisfactory methods of the distributing system...

"The most economical use of farm products is by the grower, and when he has a surplus the most economical user are his neighbors," said Mr. McIntosh.

"Sometimes growers supply their neighbors with their own surplus through long, devious, and expensive channels. The potato growers of Coos Bay have often sold their potatoes to their neighbors through San Francisco commission houses.

EXTEND FREE SERVICE TO OREGON FARMERS

O. A. C. Solicits Farmer's Correspondence—Standardization of Crops Advocated.

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, March 31.—The entire facilities of the farm crops department of the Oregon Agricultural college are offered to the farmers of Malheur county without charge.

The plan is a general improvement program which seeks to improve farm crops. It covers, first of all,

the ground of seed standardization. The department will test free of charge any sample of seed that may be submitted to it.

Potato standardization is the next objective. The department offers to examine all seeds submitted to it for the purpose of determining its purity and its vitality.

The farm crops department frequently sends extension workers direct to the farmers. In the past it has gone so far as to examine the land for the purpose of determining the crops for which it is best fitted.

Correspondence is one of the common ways in which the college is brought to the farmer. Letters asking for every kind of information are received, given careful consideration, and answered to the fullest degree from the information and experience available.

Extension work is one of the three big tasks of the agricultural colleges. The other two are the academic instruction as carried on at the college including degree courses, summer school, short courses and farmers' week, and finally, the experimental work conducted for investigation purposes.

According to L. E. Breithaupt, County Agent, Reports from farmers who have tested seed corn for germination this spring indicate that there is an unusual amount of poor seed. This is probably the result of weather conditions during the winter.

FARM BUREAU AGENT SUGGESTS SEED TEST

Seed Corn Shows Low Germination—Poor Test Likely Result From Untested Seed

A good way to test seed corn is to remove the butts and tips from the ears selected for seed and then take three or four grains from each ear, after numbering the ears.

Treat Your Potatoes Scabby potatoes, or those affected with Rhizoctonia, if they must be used for seed, should be treated with corrosive sublimate dip.
