

undefeated Crossler Playing shorthanded due to injury, the Wolverines varsity team fell 50-0 last week

to Crossler in a game that was decided early on.

The loss drops Whiteaker to 3-2 on the season, with three games remaining.

Crossler is the lone undefeated team in the league, having defeated all five of its opponents by wide margins.

"Crossler has beaten everyone pretty easily," Whiteaker head coach Tom Larimer said. "They are big, fast, strong, well coached, and play with extreme confidence. We didn't give our best effort today, but it was clear that the better and more deserving team won."

Crossler scored on the first play from scrimmage on a reverse. Following the ensuing kickoff, Whiteaker drove nearly the length of the field, using nearly seven minutes of clock, but Crossler finally forced a turnover on downs on its own 18-yard line.

Whiteaker no match for

On the very next play, the Crossler running back was hit at the line by two Whiteaker defenders, but shook off both tacklers and went 82 yards for the score.

"That put our kids on their heels and we simply did not respond well after that play," Larimer said.

Whiteaker was able to move the ball on the ground, but its defense was consistently overwhelmed by a superior Crossler squad.

Larimer went on to say that his team has been smaller than every opponent this season, and that the Wolverines must be aggressive and disciplined to make up for size

and speed. "Crossler was the aggressor today and once we got on our heels it was tough for our kids to stay disciplined," Larimer said. "Today was not our best effort. We can and will do

better." Griffin Hubbard, in his first game experience at running back, rushed nine times for 42 yards, and Quentin Camenisch added 30 yards on 11 carries. Ethan Schurr logged his first two receptions of the season, and Isaac Evarts had four solo tackles.

Whiteaker plays Claggett Creek on Wednesday, Nov. 2 at McNary High School.

But those trends didn't continue into the fourth game.

Samantha Van Voorhis, the team's starting setter, missed the match with a back injury. Outside hitter Valerie Diede, who has also been limited with a groin injury, had four kills and four blocks.

Sophomores Kara Thomas and Caiya Ewert had six and

three blocks, respectively. Myers noted the seniors have been a "tremendous" group to work with during his first season at McNary.

"They've done everything

I've asked of them," he said. "They come everyday to work hard and they've bought in to a new system. They are busting their butts to do their best."

The Lady Celts traveled to West Linn Saturday, Oct. 15 to play in a 24-team tournament that featured most of the top ranked teams in the state, including No. 1 Jesuit. McNary, 24th in the OSAA

rankings, went 1-1 in pool play, falling to No. 7 Sunset 2-0 (13-25, 14-25) and then upsetting No. 14 Lincoln 2-0 (25-23, 25-21).

Advancing to the silver bracket, the Lady Celts lost to No. 12 Sherwood 2-0 (18-25, 23-25), topped No. 23 Saint

Mary's Academy 2-1 (21-25, 25-22, 15-13) and then had their tournament end with a 2-0 (21-25, 14-25) loss to La Salle, who is ranked fifth in "It was another roller
