Now he is the center's fulltime assistant director. Sue Stacy, a Seaside teacher, has been serving as one of the wildlife center's vital volunteers for over two years. Both of these presenters enjoy learning about, caring for and sharing about local wildlife.

Some of the center's education birds will be at the program, such as an American kestral, common murres, a rhinoceros auklet, and northern fulmars. This program will cover some of the dangers wildlife face in the region, the work of the Wildlife Center of the North Coast and how people can help local wildlife.

These programs are held in the Netul River Room of Fort Clatsop's visitor center.

Ian McFeron plays Adrift Hotel

LONG BEACH, Wash. — Ian McFeron, on tour in support of his seventh studio album "Time Will Take You," will perform at 9 p.m. Friday and Saturday, Feb. 13 and 14 at the Adrift Hotel, located at 409 Sid Snyder Drive.

McFeron is joined on stage by longtime friends and musical accompanists Alisa Milner on fiddle, cello and vocals, Moe Provencher on bass and vocals, and Aimee Zoe Tubbs on drums and vocals.

In 2014, McFeron performed 181 shows all across the country. This year he expects to play as many shows as well as release his eighth studio album.

Seattle-based McFeron released "Time Will Take You" in April 2013. Produced by Doug Lancio (the Grammy Award-nominated producer for Patty Griffin), the folkrock album also includes two of Ryan Adams' Cardinals drummer Brad Pemberton and pedal-steel player Jon Graboff — as well as Nashville-based piano and organ player Micah Hulscher and two from McFeron's road band: fiddler and harmony vocalist Alisa Milner and bassist and harmony vocalist Norman Baker.

Themes for "Time Will Take You" were taken directly from McFeron's own touring experiences performing up to 170 shows per year across the United States. The album maintains stout-hearted positivity while exploring themes of troubled times, hard traveling, and a thin pocketbook. Fans of John Lennon, Bob

Dylan, Paul Simon, and Jackson Browne will feel at home.

In March of 2014, McFeron released a 10-track acoustic album, titled "Acoustic," recorded in just two days at Studio Litho in Seattle. The album features previously released songs as well as four unrecorded songs presented in a stripped-down acoustic format.

Before the movie during Astoria's Second Saturday Art Walk, NCFW will host an open house at its new home, located at 577 18th St.


