In addition to her parents, she is survived by a sister, Heather Tadei; a brother, Mark Hippensteel; three

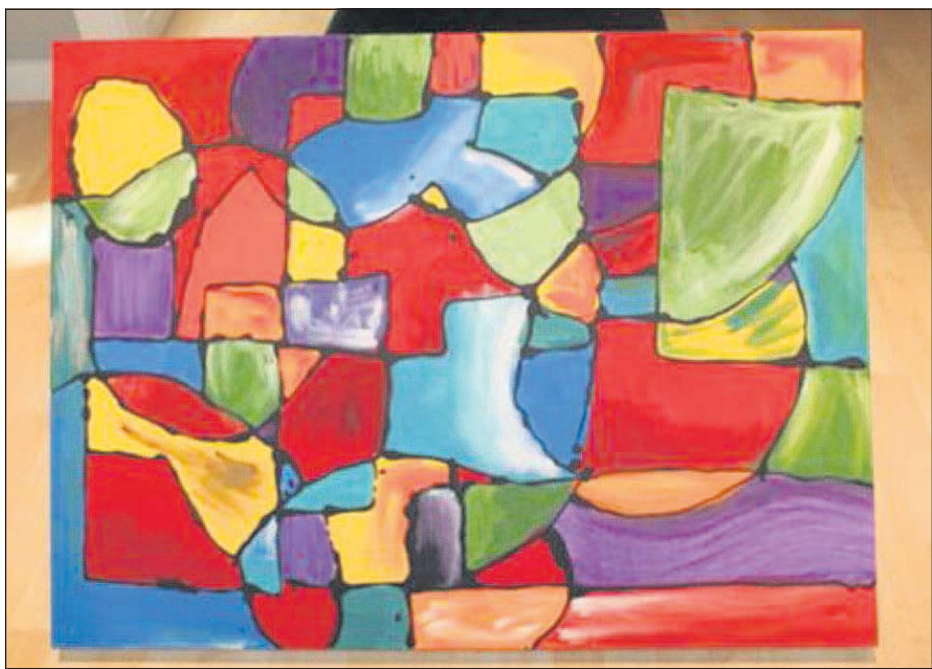

Rollins: Seaside girl inspires Boone's honorary artist bill

A 2013 report by the Oregon Arts Commission, based on public school data from the 2011-12 school year, found that 23 percent of the state's kindergarten-through-12th-grade schools did not offer any arts instruction in stand-alone courses.

The art access rate in Clatsop County, according to the report, was 80 percent.

"We've seen a lot of our electives kind of disappear," said Trent Rollins, Hayley's father, who teaches math and physical education at Broadway Middle School.

Trent Rollins said art can help "enlighten their minds and keep them engaged and excited."

He said his daughter, whose interest in painting started in fifth grade, has had art instruction at the Trail's End Art Association in Gearhart and with Seaside artists Judi Garrity and Dorota Haber-Lehigh.

Hayley Rollins said she spoke with Boone, D-Can-

non Beach, when the representative visited Broadway Middle School last year. The bill has had first reading in the House and has been referred to the House Rules Committee.

Boone said she hopes to have Hayley in Salem to either testify for the bill or watch a House floor vote. The representative said she has been an advocate for adding art to the emphasis on science, technology, engineering and math education.

"You see those bumper stickers saying: 'Art Saves Lives.' It's true," said Boone, who paints and has a degree in art from Portland State University.

Rollins toyed with recommending April 15 as Honorary Artists of Oregon Day because it is famed Italian Renaissance painter Leonardo da Vinci's birthday.

Leaning in — as Facebook's Sheryl Sandberg might suggest — she chose April 14. "That's my birthday," Rollins said.

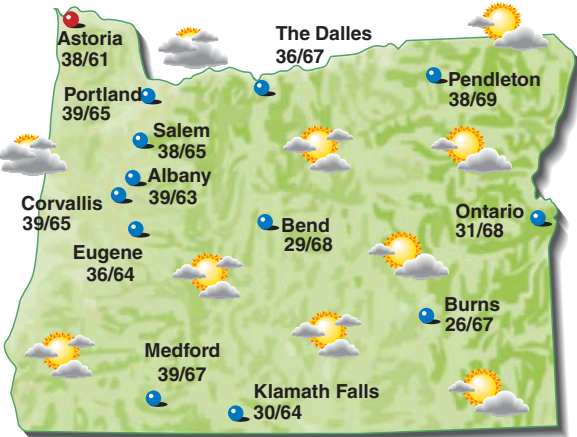

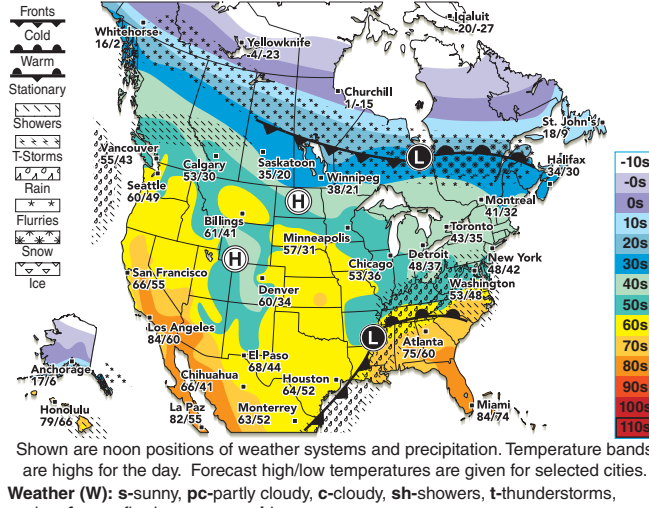
