

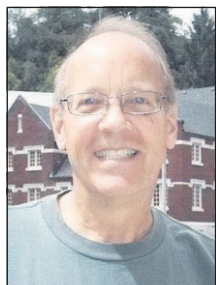

## Transferable county park passes on sale in July

Beginning July 1, the Clatsop County Parks Division will be selling a new, one-price annual parks pass that is transferable among vehicles.

The \$30 pass can be used

in any of the three fee-use county parks — Carnahan, Cullaby Lake and John Day.

The pass replaces the tiered pass (\$25 for one vehicle plus \$5 per additional vehicle) to improve convenience for the parks division

and park users, according to the county.

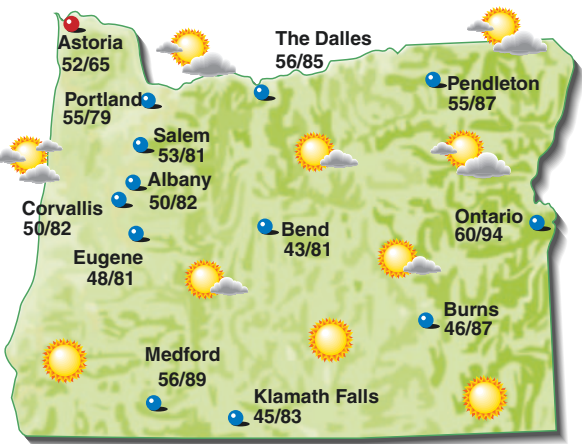

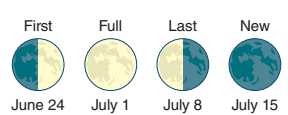

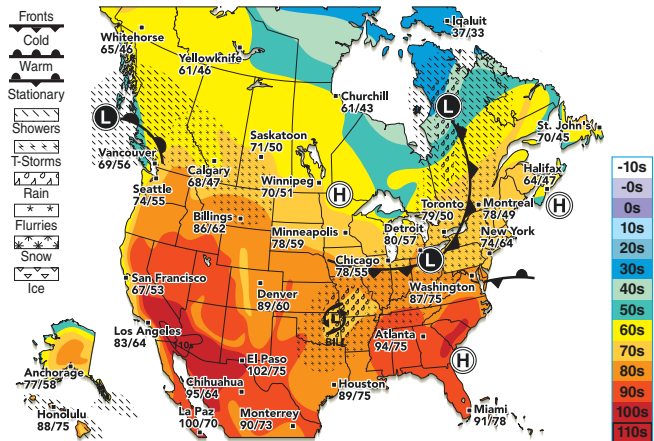
