# Astoria students score \$1.8 million in scholarships

The graduating seniors this year at Astoria High School raked in \$1.8 million worth of scholarships.

"Coffee with a Cop" is a national initiative supported by the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services. Similar events are being held across the county.

The program aims to advance the practice of community policing through improving relationships between police officers and community members one cup of coffee at a time.




