BARLEY FIRM AND GOOD DEMAND

Heavy Trading in Wheat—Competition at Interior Point—Eastern Butter Coming in—Statistics for Hop Sellers.

Cereals—Wheat, firm and active; oats, steady; barley, firm on California's short crop.

Fruit—Supply heavy, demand good, prices maintained.

Hops—Demand in quantity and excellent in quality.

Wool—Oregon grades steady in Eastern markets.

Dairy Produce—Butter in good supply, prices maintained and Eastern brands common.

Eggs—Supply heavy and high-grade in light supply and steady; vegetable active and unchanged.

Meats—Active and firm.

Merchandise—Salt higher, beans lower, turpentine higher, tobacco higher, nails lower.

In the past six days Portland has seen another week of exceptionally good business.

The wheat movement is in full swing, and other grains are not only changing hands in large quantities, but are moving freely by land and water.

The trade in fresh fruits is at its height, and enormous stocks are being carried to the coast.
