A cable from London says recent storms have eriously damaged the wheat crop of England, and that the season's harvest is expected to ove one of the worst in the last 20 years. FLOUR-The Portland flour market is firm at unchanged prices. Considerable Valley wheat is passing into millers' hands. The foreign flour trade is thus summarized by Beerbohm's Corn Trade List of August 29:

Corn Trade List of August 29: The past week's imports of flour were 146,340 macks, against 127,000 sacks last week, and 148,160 sacks last year, making the total since August 1, 360,660 sacks, against 505,880 sacks same time last year.
