

FRUITS IN DEMAND

Warm Weather Stimulates This Line of Trade.

RECEIPTS OF ALL KINDS LARGE

Several Good Lots of Wheat Taken by Millers-Hops Dull and Weak-More Activity in the Wool Market.

In the past week, on outgoing steamers, both from Portland and Puget Sound ports, freight space has been almost entirely reserved for flour.

The market for mill feed is quiet and unchanged from the figures of a week ago.

The New York Journal of Commerce of the 9th inst. said of the New York market: Business continued slow and the tone of the market was easy.

The Waterfalls Times of July 7 says: "If hope are ever going to do anything the past week has been the weather for them.

Cereals-Wheat, steady; some buying on milling account; oats and barley quiet; flour better; export inquiry.

Wool-Active, firm and Valley grades higher. Farm Produce-Poultry firm; eggs firm; butter steady.

Green Produce-Fruit active, with strong city and shipping demand; vegetables steady; potatoes weak.

Groceries-Canned corn strong; other lines unchanged. Meats-Beef lower; hogs higher; other steady.

The most activity in the past week has apparently been in the summer produce markets.

Exporters and importers at the port of New York for the week ended July 3 compare as follows:

After a prolonged period of cold, wet weather, the temperature has at last improved, and although it is not very high, it is more favorable for the wheat crop in this country.

The weather has been so generally favorable, that the yield will be below an average, and that the crop will be smaller than last year's.

Receipts of fruit were the heaviest of the season, and the demand was strong enough to keep up most of the crop, having advanced arrivals was a mixed car of watermelons and cantaloupes.

Chickens are still in demand, and the supply is adequate, and they are steady.

The demand for wool is active, and the price is 10 to 15 cents higher than last week.

VIOLENT LIQUIDATION OF STOCKS IN NEW YORK.
