C., Sept. 14.—If an international fish hatchery is to be established and maintained on Fraser River, in British Columbia, in accordance with the wishes of the salmon interests on Puget Sound, it will, in all probability, have to be established under a mutual arrangement between the State of Washington and the Province of British Columbia.

MONEY FOR BANKS

Shaw Deposits \$4,000,000 in Government Funds.

PACIFIC COAST GETS A SHARE. Distribution Is, in Large Part, to Small National Institutions in Cotton and Grain-Growing Districts.

CHANGES URGED AT ARMY FORT. WASHINGTON, Sept. 14.—General C. W.
