CLOSE SALE OF BERRIES.

Russellville Growers Accept Terms Offered by D. E. Meikle.

At the meeting of the Portland Fruitgrowers' Association held in the Russellville schoolhouse last evening, the growers decided to accept the proposition D. E. Meikle to take 80 per cent of their berries at the following prices. Strawberries, 4 cents; raspberries, 5 cents; blackberries, I cents, without regard to varieties. By acceptance of Mr. Mcikle's their action at a former meeting. wanted Mr. Mcikie to give a heavy bond, but he has given them sufficient assur-ances that he will carry out his part of the agreement. A considerable number of the members signed the contract with the representative of Mr. Melkle, who was present, and the work of securing the other growers in the district will be taken up at once.

By the terms of the contract the grower obligates himself to deliver a certain per cent of his berries, payment to be made weekly. A committee will assist in seuring signatures to the contract during
