Guilty of Breaking Eight-Hour Law

BOSTON, Oct. 15. - A verdict of guilty was returned in a tast case brought against William E. Ellis, a brought against william E. Eilis, a local contractor, who was charged with violating the Federal eight-hour law on work at the Charlestown Navy-yard. The irial was held in the United States District Court.
