rest, shot and fatally wounded Deputy Mitchell. Smith escaped, but was cap-tured and placed in Jail. Late last night a mob dynamited the structure, fired several volleys into his cell and left the negro for dead.

While the mob was storming the jail : crowd of negroes began firing at the be-siegers. Over 560 shots were exchanged and D. Melarke, a white man, was fatally injured. Several negroes are sup-posed to have been shot. This morning Smith was found to be alive in the jall, but his arms had to be amputated.
