NEW YORK, April 1.—In an effort to recover from Elmer E. Smathers the gold cup won by his horse in a race with the trotting mare Lou Dillon at Memphis on October 18, 1904, the Memphis Trotting Association, as plaintiff, began today in lay before Justice Greenbaum and a jury in the Supreme Court all of the facts connected with the alleged drugging of the mare as the result of a conspiracy planned by Smathers.
