

MANSHU TO RETURN

Japanese Steamer Chartered to Come to Portland.

TAKEN BY REGULAR LINE

Portland & Asiatic Company Will Load Vessel for Japanese Ports. Will Arrive Here Early in June. News of the Waterfront.

The Japanese steamship *Manshu Maru*, which loaded at this port for Japan during the first part of March, has been re-chartered by the Portland & Asiatic Steamship Company and will return to Portland in June. The general cargo for three ports in Japan. The *Manshu Maru* is now bound for Salinas Cruz with coals and is due to arrive soon. She will reach the Columbia River about June 1.

The steamship *Manshu Maru* sailed from Portland for the Orient March 12 of this year. She carried 46,788 bushels of wheat and 22,724 barrels of flour and called at Kobe, Moji and Yokohama. The steamer made a fast run out and as soon as she was discharged she received coals for Panama. The vessel will take a large quantity of flour and some general cargo.

With the addition of the *Manshu Maru* to the regular fleet of the Portland & Asiatic Steamship Company, that concern will have three steamers to load Oriental cargoes during the month. The *Namataki* is one of the largest flour and grain carriers that enters the port. With the addition of the steamers of the North China line, operated by Frank Waterhouse & Co. of Seattle, the exports for the month of June will be well up toward the record mark.

Wheat export business to the continent is practically at an end for the season. The British ship *Yola* is in the harbor discharging. The *Bayonne* is working what is about the last of the sailing craft to get away until new crop business opens. Flour business to the Far East has never been as good as at the present time. The record for May exports of flour is 1,247,000 bushels, which is the largest amount for the corresponding month of previous years. That this condition will continue for some time is expected by all dealers and shippers. There is still enough wheat in the interior to keep things busy until a new crop is available.

LIGHTSHIP PARTS HER CABLE

Goes Adrift and Is Rescued by the Wallula and Heather.

ASTORIA, Or., May 10.—(Special)—During a heavy southeast wind at 1 o'clock this morning Columbia River lightship No. 50 parted her mooring cable close to the anchor and started to drift north before the wind and current. The steam schooner *Quinn* was in the vicinity and, hastening in, notified the tug *Wallula* and the tender *Heather*, which were met inside the bar, and those two vessels went to the rescue. The lightship was picked up about four miles off North Head and towed inside by the *Wallula*. The *Heather* keeping close at hand to render assistance if needed. The lightship was taken to the Tongue Point buoy station, where she will be equipped with a new anchor and her cable repaired, when she will be taken out to her station off the mouth of the river.

TRIAL TRIP OF MARIOFFER

New Steam Schooner Will Be Given a Run Down the Columbia.

The new steam schooner *J. Marhofer*, which was built on Gray's Harbor for Olson & Mahony and which received her names at the Willamette Iron & Steel Works, will leave the company's dock at 5 o'clock this morning on her trial trip. The steamer will make an extended voyage and will be given every chance to prove her worth. The *Marhofer* is a duplicate of the *Jim Butler* and the *Helena*, which were fitted by the Willamette Iron Works.

MATHLOMA ON WAYS MONDAY

Snagboat Will Be Repaired at the Joseph Supple Shipyard.

The United States snagboat *Mathloma* will go out on ways at Supple's yard Monday morning and will be given a thorough overhauling. A number of new planks will be placed in her hull and she will be painted before going into the water. Her engines have been thoroughly overhauled.

SCHOOL BOYS PLAY POKER

TACOMA SCHOOL BOARD LAYS BLAME ON PARENTS.

Fathers Gamble on Wheat, Mothers Play for Prizes and Boys Ante With Pennies.

TACOMA, Wash., May 10.—(Special)—A number of students were called on to testify today regarding reports of gambling at the high school. President Drury, of the Board of Education, today said: "Several weeks ago we conducted an investigation and found that some of the boys were playing poker and we have endeavored to stop it, and the result has been given orders to get rid of every boy when he becomes a menace to the morals of the rest of the students. Their parents, in many cases, are to blame. There is a bucket shop, an Equitable building, where men gamble on wheat; then mothers go out in the afternoon and gamble for prizes at a card party, and what can you expect of the boys? They have inherited the gambling spirit and instead of spending their pennies for lunch at school, they have been using them to gamble and play penny ante."

WATER POERS FROM GROUND

La Grande Excited Over Successful Operation of Artesian Well.

LA GRANDE, Or., May 10.—(Special)—Great excitement and enthusiasm prevailed in La Grande this morning. Miller & West, of Prosser, Wash., who have been drilling a well for the O. R. N. near the new roundhouse have struck artesian water with a flow of 300 feet per minute at a depth of 800 feet. The first strike was made at 10 o'clock Saturday night. The work was continued Monday and at 5 o'clock in the afternoon the flow was increased five gallons to the minute, but at 2 o'clock in the night a much larger flow began and the flow is now 200 gallons a minute.

The contractors are much elated and confidently expect that in a few feet more they will be able to strike water of sufficient quantity to produce a great gusher.

If this well proves to be a success many more will be commenced soon, and several that were undertaken some time ago and drilled several hundred feet will be carried to completion.

If artesian water can be found here in large quantities, it will mean millions to one of the richest valleys in Oregon.

PARDON FOR JAMES WHITE

Convicted Man Offered Opportunity to Escape Prison Term.

SALEM, May 10.—(Special)—Governor Chamberlain today decided to grant a conditional pardon in favor of James White, the sailor boarding-house man who was convicted of kidnaping C. A. Burns in Portland in February, 1903. White was indicted for the crime of kidnaping Harry and "Mysterious Billy" Smith. The latter two pleaded guilty and were fined \$50. James White pleaded not guilty and was convicted and sentenced to one year in the penitentiary. He appealed; the case was affirmed, and now, after the lapse of over four years, he is about to be brought to prison. The Governor takes the view that James White, though the least culpable of the three, has been given the greater penalty. In view of this and the fact that White has conducted himself in a law-abiding manner since his trial, the Governor has decided to pardon him provided he will pay a fine of \$50 and the court costs, amounting to nearly \$100. The pardon, if accepted on these terms, will also be conditioned upon future good behavior. The Governor will offer the conditional pardon to White in Portland tonight.
