

### METHODS OF FRAUD

**McCormack Tells How Land Was Gobbled Up.**

**HYDE'S AGENT IN SALEM**

**Secured School Land Applications by Wholesale and Received 10 Cents an Acre Commission. Grabbers Not Harmonious.**

WASHINGTON, April 16.—The principal witness for the government today in the Hyde-Diamond-Rossan-Schneider land-trust case before Justice Stanford, in the District Court, was E. F. McCormack, a banker of Salem, Or. He told of the numerous transactions involving public lands of Oregon in which Hyde and himself were interested financially. The other witnesses were Jacobus Kincaid, Felix A. Curtis and Marian L. Doyle, ex-officio in Hyde's office. The defense sought to offset the weight of McCormack's testimony relating to land transactions by admitting that Hyde furnished the money to finance certain deals and that McCormack was only an agent. Mr. McCormack testified that he paid his own money for all the land he purchased, but that he always drew drafts on Hyde for reimbursement.

**Got Land on Commission.**  
The events covered by the testimony extended over three years dating from 1887. In that year he met Hyde and agreed to become Hyde's agent in the scheme to buy up vacant school lands in Oregon. Later he appeared before the State Land Board in numerous cases in which Hyde was interested. Mr. McCormack said he was compensated by Hyde at the rate of 10 cents an acre for land acquired. He said he received a 10-cent fee of land applications from Schneider, who had been sent to Oregon by Hyde.

### CHARGE NOT TRUE

**Divorce Libel Against Julia Marlow Withdrawn.**

**FILING ADMITTED ERROR**

**Lawyer for Mrs. Karl S. Von Hermann Makes Statement—Actress and Mrs. Maude Backus Dismissed as Co-respondents.**

BOSTON, April 16.—Attorney Percy A. Brigham, of this city, who filed a divorce libel in the Essex County Superior Court at Salem recently on behalf of L. von Hermann, against Carl S. von Hermann, in which Miss Julia Marlowe, the actress, and Mrs. Maude Thornburn Backus, of Brockton, were named as co-respondents, has had the libel dismissed on motion before Judge Richardson in the Superior Court. This means that the names of Miss Marlowe and Mrs. Backus are eliminated from the case. Mr. Brigham said tonight:

"I have known Mrs. von Hermann for a great many years, as well as other members of the family, and for that reason was induced to prosecute the libel in her behalf. That Mrs. von Hermann was sincerely honest in all her allegations as contained in the libel against Miss Marlowe and Mrs. Backus, I am convinced, but after a closer investigation and a more careful sifting of the evidence I feel convinced that the source of Mrs. von Hermann's information is wholly unreliable. This does not alter my belief that Mrs. von Hermann should be granted relief by the court, or in other words, a divorce from her husband on other grounds which in no way involve Miss Marlowe or Mrs. Backus and of which grounds I was in ignorance when I took the case."

### FLOOD WATER GOES DOWN

**Hauser Lake Does No Damage in Passing Great Falls.**

**HELONA, Mont., April 16.**—The high water in the Missouri River north of this city, caused by the break in the Hauser Lake power dam, on Tuesday, has receded and the river is now about at its normal stage. Since the land on both sides of the river from Hauser Lake to Helona, the site of the proposed third dam, a distance of more than 20 miles, is practically all owned by the Helena Power Transmission Company, the property loss, aside from the damage to the structure, will be nominal.

**THINKS POLLARD TOLD LIE**

SAN FRANCISCO, April 16.—At the close of the preliminary hearing of Mrs. Emma Pollard, charged with assault to murder, for the alleged shooting of her actor husband, Harry Pollard, Police Judge Shortall today declared that the testimony of Pollard, to the effect that he had accidentally shot himself, was an insult to the intelligence of the court and intimated that it might be well for the District Attorney to look into the sworn statements of Pollard with a view to the institution of a perjury charge. The case was continued to Monday for decision.
