

BALLOT'S WINNER

James R. Keene's Horse First in Suburban Handicap.

TRACK RECORD IS BROKEN

Favorites of Crowd All but Smashes World's Fastest Time for Mile and Quarter - Court Enjoins Police.

NEW YORK, June 19.—Ballot, a sturdy 4-year-old son of Voter, at Sheepshead Bay today carried the famous white with blue polka-dot colors of James R. Keene to victory in the Suburban handicap, the premier racing event of the United States.

The time for the mile and a quarter was 2:30, being one-fifth of a second slower than the world's record for the distance, made by Bromstick at Brighton Beach July 9, 1904.

The enforcement of the new law against betting had its effect upon the attendance, for not more than 20,000 persons passed through the gates to witness the classic day.

Passing the furlong pole, the Voter colt took command, and thereonward it was easy sailing for him. Two lengths to the good, Master Robert took Ballot and raced him in easy fashion toward the upper turn, though even at that pace was fast enough to set the field behind him.

Easy Winner at Wire.

At the wire Ballot was the easiest kind of winner and King James as easily defeated Fair Play for the place. The others were beaten off.

There was considerable betting on the race today. It was easier to lay a wager than on previous days since the new anti-betting law went into effect, because counsel for theoney Island Jockey Club early in the day secured an injunction restraining the police from interfering with the orderly gathering of crowds of persons in any portion of the grounds.

The fact that Justice Bischoff, of the Supreme Court, had granted the restraining order, was telephoned to the track immediately and a large number of the 300 police who were present to see that the law was enforced left the inclosure. There remained, however, a number sufficient for all emergencies. No arrests were made during the afternoon.

DENVER, June 18.—In the Overland Park case today, Judge Carlton M. Elias, of the District Court, held that betting on horse races is unlawful according to the statutes of Colorado, and dissolving the writs of prohibition issued against the justices who issued warrants for bookmakers.

Attorneys for the bookmakers filed notice of an appeal and hope to prevent further proceedings until the Supreme Court shall have passed upon the matter.
