SCHOOL TO BE DEDICATED

CATHOLIC SERVICE AT PIEDMONT CHAPEL TOMORROW.

Redemptorist Fathers Will Open New Building With Address by Bishop Charles J. O'Reilly.

The new school and chapel of the Holy Redeemer parish, at Piedmont, will be dedicated Sunday forenoon with appropriate services, which will begin at 10:30 o'clock. Most Rev. Archbishop Alexander Christie will officiate, assisted by the clergy of Oregon and Washington. Following the blessing of the building by the archbishop will be solemn high mass. Bishop Charles J. O'Reilly, of Baker City, will deliver the sermon. A large choir in the charge of M. J. Keating, accompanied by a full orchestra, will sing Rosewig's mass. After the mass the women of the parish will serve dinner to all visitors, and from 12:30 to 2:30 o'clock Tomlinson's band will give a concert in the adjoining grove. At 3 P. M. the following vocal and instrumental programme will be rendered:

The Redemptorist Fathers and their parishioners have invited the people of Portland and vicinity to attend the dedication ceremony. Those attending from the city may take the "U" car and leave the car at Killingsworth street and Williams avenue and walk north to the grounds; or they may take the Woodlawn car and leave the car at Portland boulevard and walk west to the chapel.

At the invitation of Archbishop Christie, the provincial of the Redemptorist

Fathers of St. Louis, Mo., came to Portland in 1906, to establish a parish, with the result that 11 acres in all were secured on the Portland boulevard. For a time the fathers rented a dwelling where services have been conducted. The land is most admirable for purpose of the parish, overlooking the Columbia River and the Cascade Mountains. The people of the young parish have been looking forward to the dedication of the new home with great pleasure. The plans of the Redemptorists embrace the erection of a fine church, school, priests' residence and convent for the teaching sisters. The members of the Redemptorist community are Rev. Fathers Cantwell, Guendling, Meyer, MacDonald and Wagner and Brothers Peter and Francis. The school will open in September under the charge of the Sisters of the Holy Names.

WILL CELEBRATE FOURTH

Day Will Be Fittingly Observed at Pleasure Resort.

The Nation's birthday will be observed with a rousing Fourth of July celebration at The Oaks this year. Plans for the day's programme are now being considered by Manager Freeman, of that resort. PREPARE TO BURY WIRES

ENGINEER WILL LAY OUT LOCAL SYSTEM.

M. S. Hopkins Arrives in City to Plan Changes in Compliance With Recent Ordinance.

M. S. Hopkins, of Columbus, Ohio, consulting engineer for the railway and electric light properties of E. W. Clark & Company, owners of the Portland Railway, Light & Power Company, reached Portland last night and today will consult with the officers of the local company, when some plan will be adopted for the distribution of electricity in the underground district of Portland.

"As soon as these plans have been decided upon," said President Josselyn, of the local company, yesterday, "we will be able to proceed immediately with the construction of an underground system for our wires, as required by the ordinance passed by the City Council and requiring that our wires be placed underground in certain congested districts of the city by September 1, 1909."

"The removal of these wires from the business streets will be a great factor of safety and will assist materially in beautifying the city."

SPEAK ON WORK IN AFRICA

Sermon by Dr. Dye at First Christian Church.

Dr. Royal J. Dye, of Bolenge, Africa, will speak at the First Christian Church, Park and Columbia streets, at both services tomorrow. Dr. Dye will be accompanied by his wife.

The church at Bolenge, Africa, is one of the most remarkable churches of modern times. It is unique in that every

member is a tithier; but its special claim to distinction is the fact that every ten members support a native evangelist.

This church now has a membership of 500, with 1000 in the Sunday school, and supports 48 native evangelists. This is where Africa beats America. Possibly there is not a church in Portland, every one of whose members gives to the spread of the gospel, much less gives a tenth.

Dr. Dye is a young man, in this country on a furlough. He is one of the greatest missionaries of modern times and has a fascinating story to tell of the wonderful work at Bolenge. He has aroused enthusiasm wherever he has spoken. He will speak at 11 A. M. and 8 P. M.
