

TEST WITH "IN-THE-BOX" LAW

Turn Halle Management Will Bring Action in Courts to Decide Matter.

POLICE RAID THE RESORT

Respectable Women Are Caught in the Dragnet and Victims Declare Their Intention to Fight to the Finish.

The ordinance recently passed by the city council, and that the arrest of the exclusion of women from saloons is to be tested much sooner than expected, and this contingency was brought about by the raid on the Turn Halle Cafe by Patrolman G. W. Fuller, a new man on the police force, yesterday afternoon.

Charles Kitchner, one of the proprietors of the resort at Fourth and Yamhill, and five women patrons of the place were placed under arrest by the newly appointed officer, who entered the resort and finding the women there decided to act upon what he construed to be his duty. Several women were present, but the only one being alone, despite his threat to use his gun, was unable to prevent them from leaving before making the arrest.

Case Will Be Contested.

Mr. Kitchner says that his cafe complies with all of the provisions of the city ordinance, and that the arrest is totally without warrant. He furthermore contends that the police officer who made the arrest had absolutely no right to interfere with his business, and that he will contest the case to the limit. It is also possible that the proprietor will file charges against the officer as soon as the case has been decided by the courts.

What the Law Provides.

Following is City Attorney Kavanaugh's interpretation of the ordinance.

Ordinance No. 1800 is violated if any licensed liquor dealer, or the owner or proprietor of any saloon, drinking shop, or place where intoxicating liquors are sold for sale or sold at retail or served, either by himself or permit any female person to enter such place for the purpose of drinking or buying any intoxicating liquor, or to remain or loiter in or about any room, back, booth, alcove, or any other place connected in any way with such place. Female persons may enter such place upon any proper business, and may be prevented by law from entering such place for any other purpose. But they can be prevented from entering for the purpose of buying or drinking intoxicating liquors. Intoxicating liquors are not to be sold or served, but to be kept for sale or sold at retail or served. There is specially excepted from the operation of this ordinance any place where a store is operating as such. This means that the grocery or drug business and not as an adjunct to a liquor store or drinking place.

Increasing quantities of Minnesota butter are coming into the Oregon market, on account of the impaired grade of Oregon product. The market is about 8 cents a pound under that of this region, and as the Minnesota butter can be laid down here at a cost of between 1 and 2 cents a pound, there is a margin of 4 or 5 cents a pound for admission of the outside product.

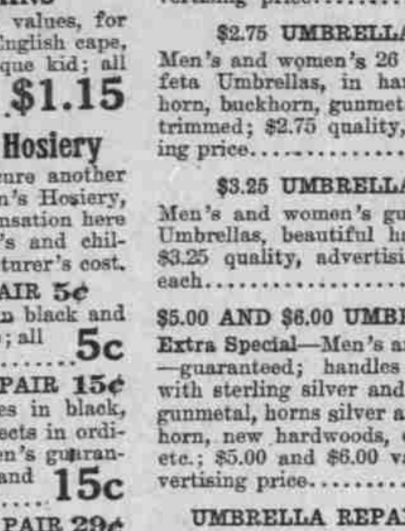
