

BOURSE ALARMED BY FRENCH MOVE

Good Effect of America's Election Handicapped by Casa Blanca Incident.

STOCKS GO DOWN FAST

France Accepts Germany's Proposal to Arbitrate Over Descriptions. Kaiser's Government Then Backs Down on One Provision.

PARIS, Nov. 4.—The generally good impression upon financial sentiment in this city produced by the election of Bryan has been more than offset, at least temporarily, by the renewed anxiety over the attitude adopted by Germany in the matter of the Casa Blanca incident.

France accepted this proposal, provided that the arbitration should cover the question whether or not Germany had infringed the neutrality of the sea.

The situation created alarm on the Bourse this morning, which opened excited and lower. A gradual calmness settled, but the usual measure of calling the German Federal Council together to consider the political situation continued to hang over the market.

The Bourse recovered again at the close on the rumor that Germany had demanded the recall of the French Consul at Casa Blanca.

DELAWARE ASSEMBLY CLOSE

May Require Official Count to Determine Control.

WILMINGTON, Del., Nov. 4.—The returns from rural Newcastle County and from Kent and Sussex, the two lower counties in Delaware, are unusually slow in coming in, but enough information has been received to show that the entire Republican state ticket, with the exception of Davis for Attorney-General, has been elected.

C. E. Creger, Republicans, are elected to Congress from the First, Second and Third districts, a Republican gain of two.
