Secretary of War Calls Brigadier-General to Troops Expected to Move.

TELEGRAM URGES HASTE

Department of Columbia Commander Prepares to Leave, in Advance of Schedule, for New Charge of Albany, N. Y., Brigade.

ANCOUVER BARRACKS, Wash., Feb. 12.—(Special.)—Brigadier-General Nelson P. Maus, commander of the Department of the Columbia, today received a telegraphic order from the Secretary of War to proceed, as soon as practicable, to join his brigade at Albany, N. Y. This is the first Brigade of the First Division, and according to press dispatches, may be ordered to move towards Mexico with the first troops.

In the Alameda, the great wooded park in the center of the city, the trees were mowed down by the vicious fire: small twigs and limbs cover the ground in places, evidence of the heaviness of the small arm fire. Among the buildings damaged was that of the Mutual Life Insurance Company. In the side of which a great hole was torn. Over the building during the battle the British and American flags were flying. Most of the buildings suffering the greatest damage are owned by Mexicans, but many offices in them are occupied by Americans and other foreigners.

WARNING IS ISSUED

Ambassador Wilson Reports Danger to Americans.
DISPATCHES ALARM KNOX
State Department Urges All Non-Combatants to Keep Out of Danger Zone—Embassy at Mexico City Open to All Refugees.
WASHINGTON, Feb. 12.—Alarmed by reports from Ambassador Henry Lane Wilson that the combatants in Mexico City were training their guns in such a direction as to increase the danger to Americans and other foreign residents, the State Department hurriedly dispatched instructions to Mr. Wilson tonight to warn all non-combatants to keep out of the fighting zone.

MEXICO CITY, Feb. 12.—Several stories of robbery and looting by small mobs were reported today, but for the most part the criminal as well as the law-abiding element were too terrified by the incidents of the last two days to do anything but seek places of safety. Business houses, banks and restaurants are closed and not even a railway ticket is to be bought in the uptown offices.
