The men swam the river in two heats, Allen, using the side English overarm stroke, and Stall, using the double English overarm stroke, swam across first. In the second heat Febiger, using the crawl stroke; Crueser, with the crawl, and McMurray, using the Australian crawl stroke, darted through the water at a fast clip, Struggle Is Pretty One.


