It was reported yesterday that the men had decided to accept the terms of the operators and return to work under the open shop law. President Case announced tonight that he had advised his former employees today that the two shingle mills of his company would be started tomorrow and if they care to work for him to be on hand at working time.

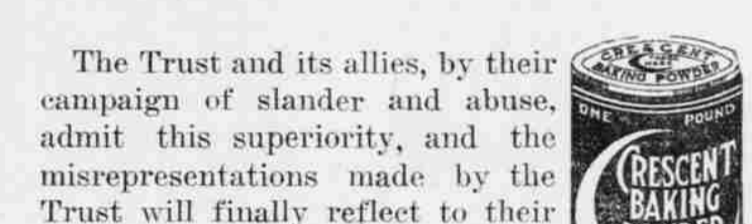
