

WOMEN CAN'T AGREE

Question of New Party Proves Disturbing Factor.

MANY QUIT ORGANIZATION

Plans Even Not Understood, as It Is Not Known Whether Intention Is to Put Own Candidates in Field or Not.

Opinions of Portland suffragists regarding the founding of a woman's party differ widely. Some of the local leaders favor the formation of the party as advocated by the Congressional Union for Women's Suffrage.

Lack of Unity Decried. "It is pitiful to think that women can't stand as a solid body at this critical time for woman's suffrage," said Mrs. W. J. Hawkins yesterday in discussing the action of the Chicago women who withdrew from the Union in anticipation of the founding of this party.

Mrs. Hawkins is one of the most prominent members of the Congressional Union in Oregon. She declared that the women who had withdrawn had in all probability put tradition and their own political beliefs before the woman question.

Plans Not Understood. "It is unfortunate that they are to call it a woman's party," said Miss Wold. "Miss Lucy Burns advised me when here last week that there was no intention to put forth candidates, but merely to get women together to work solidly for the Susan B. Anthony amendment."

TWO MEN IN LEAD

Hughes and Roosevelt May Be Republican Contestants.

BURTON MUCH IN EARNEST

Ohio Delegates Expected to Be Among Last to Leave Favorite Son Candidate—How Delegates Now Chosen Stand.

None Instructed for Hughes. There have been no instructed Roosevelt delegates thus far and the Colonel is the only candidate in the states that have elected delegates.

Difference Is Noted. But Colonel Roosevelt also, "is not a candidate," and, like Justice Hughes, has declined to assent to the placing of his name on the primary ballots in those states where there was a demand to put him in the running.

Real Fight May Develop. If the contest at Chicago, during the early balloting, develops into a fight between Hughes and Roosevelt, delegates instructed for Cummins, Ford, Sherman, LaFollette and others will be drawn into the real contest.

through the 87 delegates from that state, the home of both Hughes and Roosevelt, will go to the convention uninstructed, estimates by various New York papers indicate that about 50 delegates, more or less, entertain a personal preference for Hughes, and the Roosevelt strength is estimated at from 12 to 15, with the remainder favoring Root.

Illinois Will Abandon Sherman. While the Illinois delegation is instructed for Senator Sherman, the instruction is regarded as being nothing more than a compliment to the Senator, and the Illinois delegation will be among the first to disregard the instructions and go to other candidates.

Not even Senator LaFollette takes. LaFollette's boom seriously, but where the Senator will throw his strength is not known. He has never forgiven Colonel Roosevelt for pushing him out of the race in 1912, and if bitterness still rankles at the Chicago convention the bulk of the LaFollette strength, both in Wisconsin and in Kentucky, and possibly scattering votes from other states.

New England Mainly for Hughes. Through New England, outside of Massachusetts, there appears to be a strong sentiment for Hughes, as outside of Massachusetts there is little Weeks sentiment in evidence.

Southern delegates, as a rule, like to go on the winning side. Georgia and Louisiana will send contesting delegations to the Chicago convention. Root factions in Louisiana favor the Colonel, but in Georgia the contest lies between a delegation favoring Roosevelt and a delegation favoring anybody but Roosevelt.

Root Preferred by New Jersey. In President Wilson's state, Root seems to be the preferred candidate, with Hughes second choice and Roosevelt third. Governor Phillips of Wisconsin controls nine delegates in Wisconsin and is personally favorable to Hughes.

West Virginia delegates may not be able to participate in the convention on its opening day. The following states are yet to elect delegates: Wyoming, convention May 8; New Mexico, convention May 15; New York, convention May 16; Vermont, primary May 16; Oregon, primary May 19; South Dakota, primary May 23; West Virginia, primary June 8.
