Gliman, president of the North Bank system Trestle filling, track and bridge renewals and new work, the ifning of tunnels, extension of shop facilities and the installation of automatic block signal systems at every tunnel between Fortland and Spokane comprise the salient features of complated work.

plated work.

The company was a good buyer of Pacific Northwest lumber during the past year. Steel, iron and cement were used in large quantities. Five and a haif million feet of lumber, one and a quarter million lineal feet of piling, besides unmeasured quantities of ties. [were used.

Three tunnel-lining projects on the Vancouver division were completed. The largest of these was tunnel 18, near Farrington, Wash, with a length of 1486 feet. The lining required more than 10,000 cubic yards of concrete and the cost was \$120,600. The John Day tunnel, 176 feet in length, was reduced to an open cut at a cost of \$7000, as a measure for added safety and facility of train operation.

Block Signals Installed. An important move for safety was the finitaliation of automatic block sig-mais on the main line, protecting the approaches to the various tunnels. This feature cost \$20,000. The work extended from April to November last. Expenditures were heaviest on the Astoria division of the system. They totaled about \$350,000. Trestle rebewal at Astoria exceeded \$100,000 in cost. One hundred thousand feet of cedar piling was required on renewal work in Young's Bay. Units 1 and 2 of the reclamation of the Astoria waterfront were completed, the railroad's share for track fill being \$25,-

A \$10,000 steel bridge was constructed on the Goldendale branch at the second crossing of the Klickitat River. The bridge is 155 feet in length, the spans resting on concrete substructure. Bridge Approaches Renewed.

Two important bridge renewals were made on the Oregon Electric Railway, one at Wilsonville and the other over a county road at Moffat Station, on the Forest Grove branch. There are 2500 feet of treatle approaches on the north and south sides of the steel bridge over the main channel of the Willamette River at Wilsonville. 
