

TASKS BEYOND WHEN GOVERNMENT IS SIGNED

Serious Difficulties Yet to Be Faced by Powers.

TEST FOR TEUTONS COMING

Future Welfare of Germany Depends Largely Upon Honesty and Good-will of Its Government.

PARIS, June 26.—No man in Paris, least of all President Wilson, believes that the signing of the treaty means the end of difficulties. On the contrary, the understanding is clear that with the signing of the treaty the heaviest part of the after-war effort is yet to be faced.

Significant Changes Assured. There is not an objective minded student of the conditions as imposed who is not certain that the treaty documents possess sufficient flexibility to enable it to be bent to good purposes, provided the condition of the Germans justify such action. One who has been intimately concerned with the composition of the treaty said to me last evening that within four months, or at least six months, significant changes would be effected in the instrument calculated to alleviate those positions bearing heaviest upon defeated Germany.

Test of Honesty Coming. To the end indicated a big contribution will be made by the test of Germany to the league of nations. Much, of course, is to be predicated upon Teutonic honesty of effort. The Germans, having undertaken the task by their breach of honesty in having sunk their fleet, it is said, they will pay for everything thus destroyed, the value being assessed against them in gold at 6 per cent interest.

17 OREGON MEN TAKING TRAINING AT PRESIDIO.

19 O. A. C. Students Now in Advanced Course of Reserve Officers' Corps at Southern Camp.

PRESIDIO, San Francisco, Cal., June 26.—(Special.)—Out of the 33 men in advanced-course men of the reserve officers' training corps here, 19 are Oregon men. OLD FIRE BELL MEMENTO

Astoria Relic of Days of '78 to Have Place in City Park. ASTORIA, Or., June 26.—(Special.)—The old Astoria fire bell that was erected in 1878, and used for years to summon the members of the old volunteer fire department to duty in cases of conflagrations has been presented by the city to the park commission.

The bell is to be placed in the city park, where it will be preserved as a memento of pioneer days. The bell, which weighs slightly over 1200 pounds, was purchased by the women and presented to the volunteer department in June of 1878. It was cast at the plant of the Oregon Brass Works in Ferry, and cast George D. bears an inscription as follows: "Donated to the Astoria fire department by the ladies and citizens of Astoria through the efforts of the firemen's fair and bazaar, February 20 and 21, 1878."
