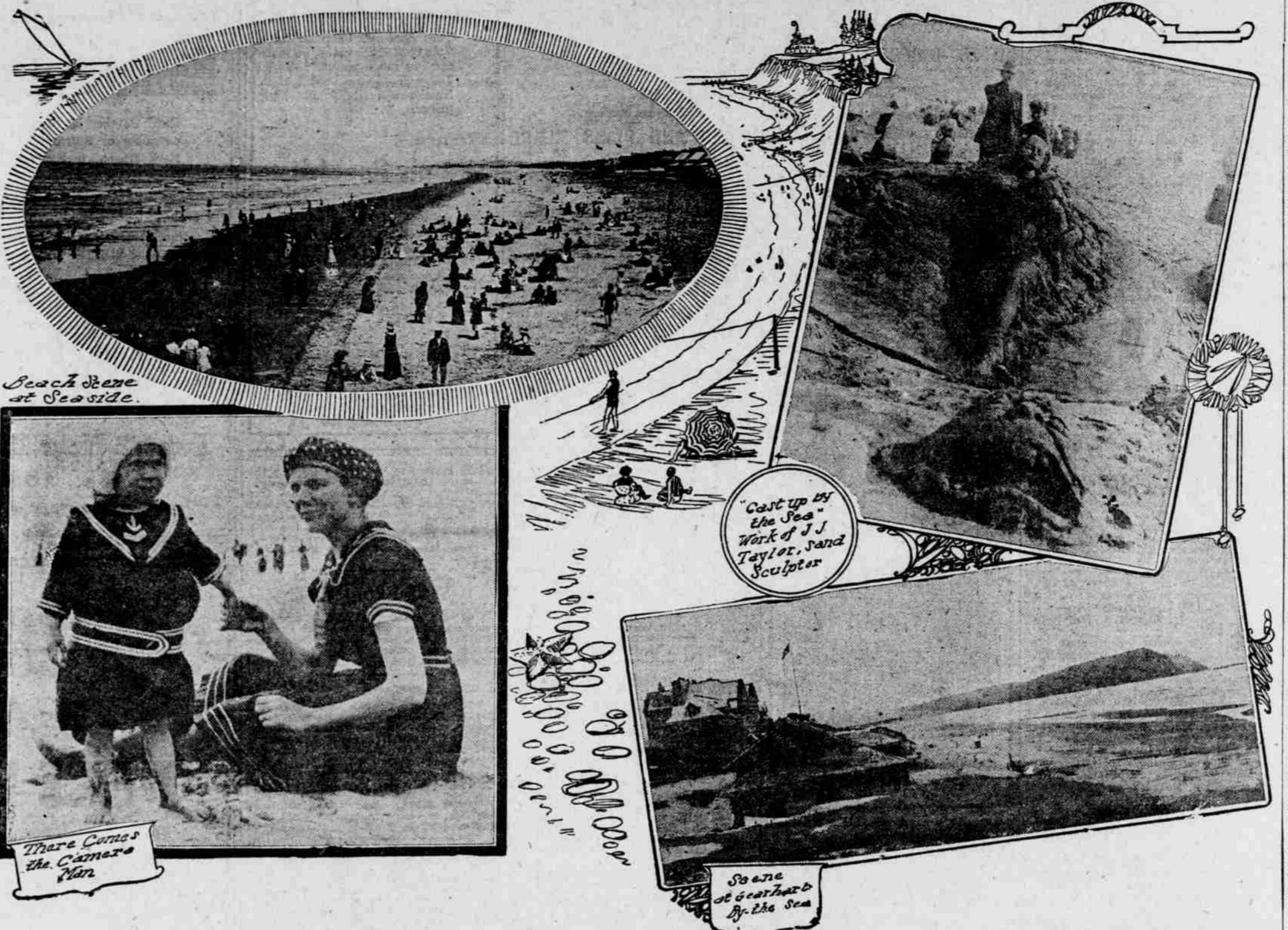


LONG BEACH PROving MORE ATTRACTIVE TO OLD AND YOUNG
