

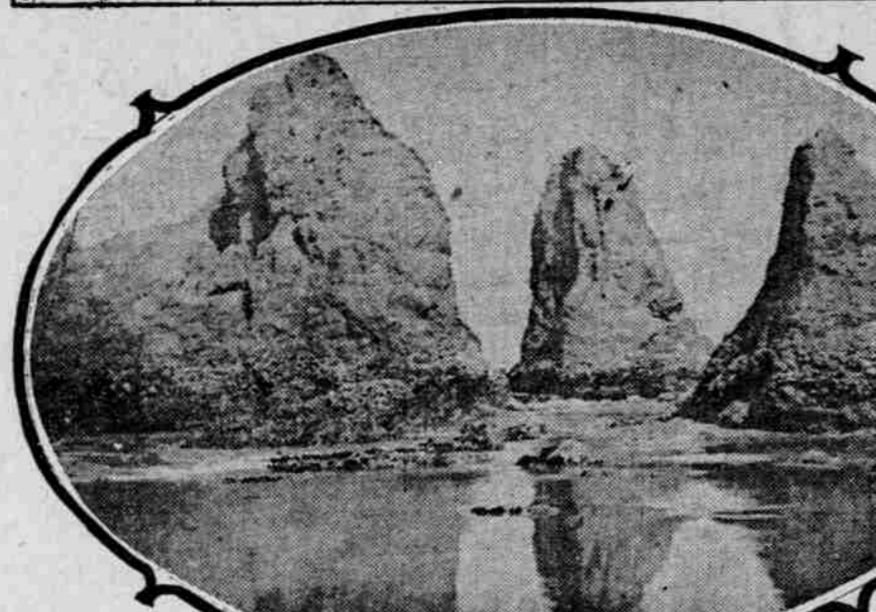
WIND-SEA WAVES DRAW HUNDREDS TO BEACHES FOR OUTINGS

Lateness of Season Fails to Stem Tide of Vacationists Making for Shore's Hotels and Cottages.

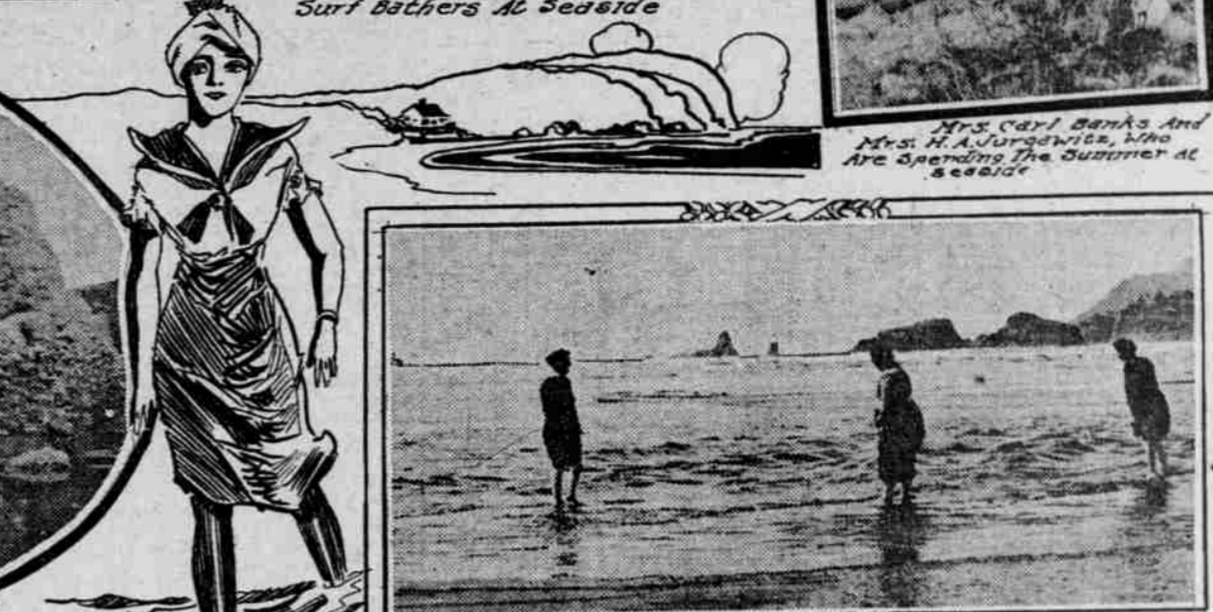

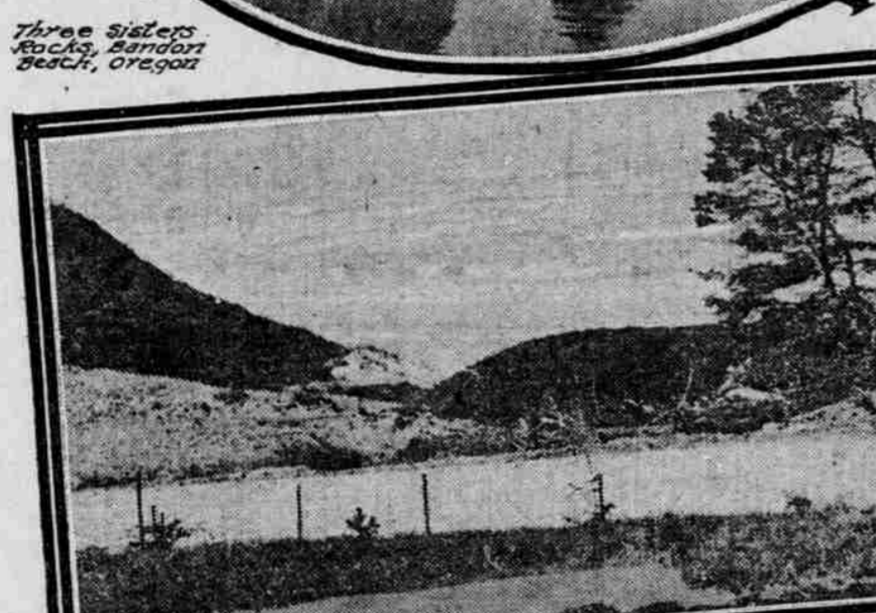

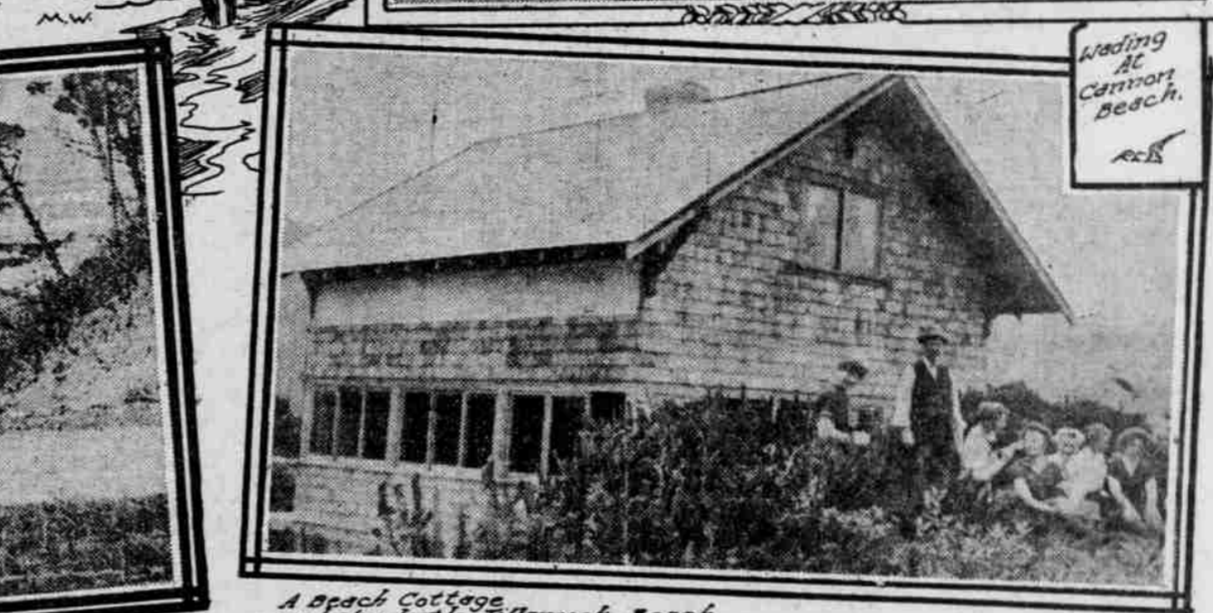
