# MASS MUSIC DROWNS OUT ALL ELSE IN GREAT WEEK IN GOTHAM SHOWS

Boston Symphony Orchestra Concerts Attract Crowds and Walter Damrosch Fills Every Niche of Aeolian Hall in Programme With Fritz Kreisler as Soloist—New Composition by Ernest Schelling Is Heard.

NEW YORK, Jan. 15.—(Special.)—This was the great week of orchestral concerts when mass music took precedence over everything else. The weeks which bring the Boston Symphony orchestra to the venerable wall of Carnegie are counted the most brilliant of the season and Dr. Muck is sure of a series of ovations. In addition to the executive and after-noon concerts of the Boston Symphony orchestra, Walter Damrosch filled every niche of Aeolian Hall for his pair of concerts, presenting as he did Fritz Kreisler as soloist, and Josef Strakosky not to be outdone gave his concert Friday afternoon, Saturday night and Sunday afternoon. Soloists for these occasions were Maximilian Pilzer, the concert master of the Philharmonic orchestra who played a concerto by Edmund Severn, a New York composer and teacher, Percy Grainger, who gave his own to the popular Saturday evening Tschakowsky-Grieg programme by playing the great Grieg concerto in which he already has won much favor, and Saturday afternoon while Kreisler was playing his second concert with Damrosch, Harold Bauer was the soloist with the Philharmonic orchestra playing the Saint-Saens G minor concerto. Perhaps the most noteworthy fact in connection with a series of performances of this sort is that in almost every case the audiences were large.

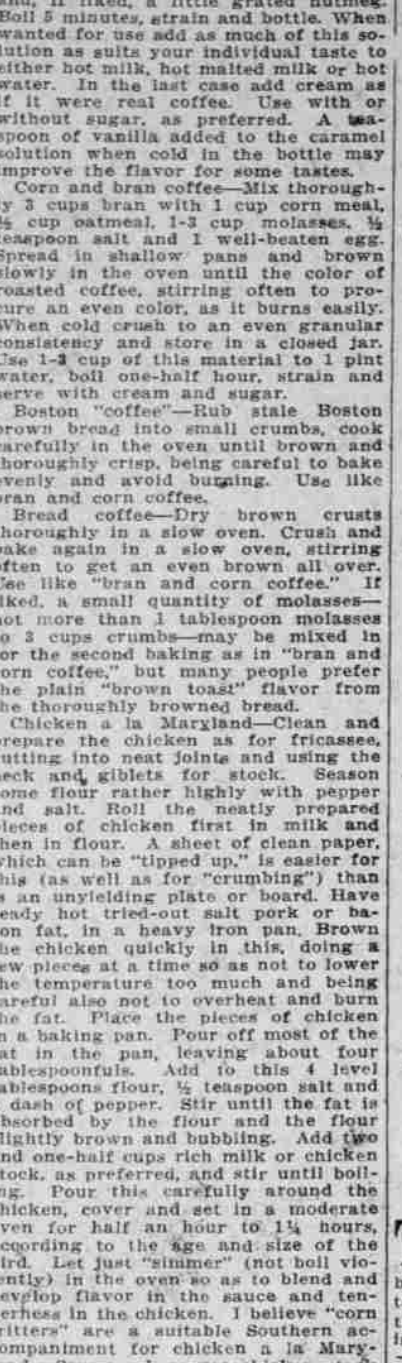
For a number of years Mr. Schelling has appeared in the cities of Europe, North and South America, and he now holds the title of court pianist to the Duke of Mecklenburg-Schwerin. Mr. Schelling is also recognized as a composer who has placed many works in the larger field of his credit, and he has frequently been heard in his own compositions with the largest orchestras of both continents. Among these are a fantasia for piano and orchestra, and a "Fantastic Suite" for piano and orchestra. He has also written a symphony and a symphonic legend for orchestra and a number of chamber music and piano-forte works.

There will be some changes in the roster of artists at the Metropolitan within the next few weeks which will bring back some of those now on concert tours and permit some of the others to disport their musical ability on the concert platform of the different cities, who have been awaiting with patience and impatience their coming.

There were also impressions of the Pioneers, a movement in memory of Gustave Mahler, an impression of a North Carolina lagoon, a vivid tone poem dated August 1914, which needed

# DEEP BORDER IS WEIGHT TO HOLD VEIL IN PLACE

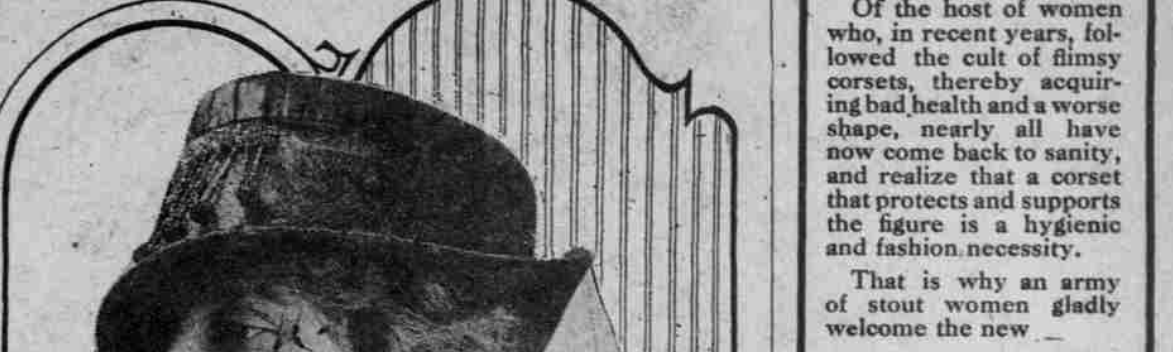
Filmy Material Falls Gently About Face and Shoulders, Adjusting Over Pressed Beaver Felt Hat of Tall Crown.
