The next one reads: "In 1847 he came to Benton county, and located on the farm now owned by Caleb Davis, which is some five miles west of this city." Mr. Pierce came to Corvallis that year to locate, but he found his claim was taken by other parties, so he returned to Lina county, where he remained till 1849, when he went to California in search of gold. The third mistake is: "At that time (1850) Corvallis had never been thought of." But it was. Mr. Avery's house was built in the spring of 1850, and goods were being sold three months before. Speaking about freight rates, the statement was made that competition between the river boats from Corvallis to Portland reduced freight from \$10 to \$6 per ton. It should have been that the introduction of railroads brought it down to \$6, and the O. & C. railroad was completed up the valley, when freight was carried as low as \$3 and \$4 per ton. We regret the occurrence of the mistakes, and we trust that these will be satisfactory corrections.
