Winnemucca Railroad.

From present appearances it will Well done. not be long before Oregon will have railway communication with the East. The passage of the Winnemucca raiload bill by the last Legislature gives it a long shove forward. The distance is short. It is only 275 miles from Eugene City to Winnemucca. The route is easy compared with the difficulties of the Union Pacific. The whole length of road to be built will be, making due allowances for curvature, 335 miles. By this route Portland will be 150 miles nearer Winnemucca than by the Portland and Sacramento route.
