the directors. The directors, of whom seven, including the president, shall be a quorum for the transaction of business, shall have full power to make and prescribe such by-laws, rules and regulations as they shall deem needful and proper touching the disposition and management of the stock, property, estate, and effects of the company, the transfer of shares, the duties and conduct of their officers and servants touching the election and meeting of the directors, and all matters whatsoever which may appertain to the concerns of said company; and the said board of directors may have full power to fill any vacancy or vacancies that may occur from any cause or causes from time to time in their said board. And the said board of directors shall have power to appoint such engineers, agents, and subordinates as may from time to time be necessary to carry into effect the object of the company, and to do all acts and things touching the location and construction and operation of said road.

THE CONTRACTOR OF

SEC. 6. And be it further enacted, That each and every grant, right, and privilege herein are so made and given to and accepted by the said Oregon branch of the Pacific Railroad Com-pany, upon and subject to the follow-ing conditions, namely: That the said company shall commence the work on said road with in two years from the approval of this act by the President, and shall complete not less than thirty miles per year after the second year, and shall construct, equip, furnish and complete the main line of the whole road by the fourth day of July, anno Domini eighteen hundred and seventyeight. And that the acceptance of the terms and conditions of this act shall be signified in writing by said company, under their corporate seal duly executed, pursuant to the direction of its board of directors first obtain ed, which acceptance shall be made within two years after the passage of this act, and shall be deposited in the office of the Secretary of the Interior,

SEC. 7. And be it further enacted, That the lands granted by this act excepting such as may be reserved by the company, for timber depots, and other needful purposes, shall be subject to settlement and to entry and sale at the land offices of the United States under the pre-emption laws at two dollars and fifty cents per acre, or such less price as the company may prescribe; and the money arising from such sales and from the transportation and other business to be done by the company for the United States shall remain in the treasury of the United States as a fund for the payment of the interest and principal of the bonds of the United States to be issued under this act. And it the said fund shall not be sufficient to pay said installment of such interest and principle as the same shall fall due, then twenty per cent of the residue of the gross earnings of the company or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be applied to such payment, and any surplus of the fund aforesaid which may remain in the said treasury after each of the semi-annual payments are made of the interest or principle then falling due shall be paid to the said company.
