GENTLEMEN:-The large number lefective, irregular, and insufficient proofs presented in public land cases, and the looseness with which attesting officers, particularly others than Registers and Receivers, have exercised heir functions, make it necessary that the following directions be carefully

emplied with: 1. In cases of final proofs and of entry applications the parties, whether applicants, claimants, or witnesses must be properly identified before you. Attesting officers (including Registers and Receivers) must certify that the parties appearing are personally known to them or that their identify is satisfactorily established. The names of persons vouching to identify must be stated. Identifying affidavits should be required in all cases where necessary. 2.
