INDIAN WARI

SAN FRANCISCO, June 8.—A dispatch from Silver City, Idaho, says about forty hostile Bannocks, camped at Juniper creek, ten miles from South Mountain, were discovered yesterday by friendly Indians.

Boise City, June 8.—James Dunn, messenger, left Col. Bernard's command at Fort Robinson, on the Bruneau, early yesterday morning, came down the Bruneau to Dorsey's Ferry on Snake river, thence followed down the north side of the river 45 miles to Monday's Ferry and thence to this place, 30 miles, riding all day and night of yesterday and arriving here at 11 o'clock today.

Col. Bernard, in consequence of these reports and the indications of the presence of Indians everywhere in the neighborhood of his command, decided to wait where he was until he could learn more definitely from Duck valley and other points.

James Bascom, brother of John Bascom, who was with two others murdered by the Indians just below Glenn's ferry, on the 1st, upon learning of the murder started from Rock Creek station, on the overland road, with an escort of four men for the purpose of visiting the scene of the murder and bringing in the bodies of the murdered men.
