**NEED MORE HOUSES.**

An opportunity to build small houses to rent presents itself now more than ever before in Marshfield. The C. A. Smith company is constantly bringing more men here to work in their mills, and will have many more. The force will be a large one and the men and their families must have places to live. The company has done much itself to provide. There are now accommodations for about 100 single men and sixteen families at Bay City, places for twenty men at the old store in Marshfield and sixty more can be comfortably roomed in the big boarding house which the company will start at once to erect. It certainly cannot be said that the company has been slow about providing regardless of expense, but it is their hope that individuals will build houses and rent or sell to the men and thus help relieve the pressure. The company is a big one and has located here, and the men must have places to live. It is not unreasonable that the people of Marshfield help to provide houses and do their part. The Smith company is certainly doing its share.

**COULD HAVE A LEAGUE.**

The baseball players of Marshfield are stirred up now to form a team to play North Bend. It is a good move. There are many people here who enjoy a ball game, and the location of the city is such that it is impossible to see any of the big games without making a long trip. There is plenty of good material here, and there is no reason why North Bend and Marshfield, with Coquille, Myrtle Point or Bandon, cannot have a league and play out a regular schedule. There is so little here in the way of sport that ball games would be hailed with joy by those who enjoy athletics and want some place to go.

**LOCAL BRICK.**

**NEW ADDITION TO THE GUERIN**

**Myrtle Point Hostelry Increases Capacity by Twenty-Two More Rooms.**

**And Lower Floor of Annex Will Be Used for Offices and Stores.**

Myrtle Point, Ore., May 6.—The annex to the Guerin hotel is almost completed. The new building is 36x50 feet and three stories high. The lower floor will be used for office or floors or store purposes. The second and third floors are divided into 22 rooms, thus adding materially to the capacity of this already commodious hostelry.
