## FRUIT MEN AT MEETING

Gathering at Chamber of Commerce at 2:30 O'clock.

Just before two o'clock this afternoon a large number of fruit men from all over the county began to gather at the mass meeting to be held at the Chamber of Commerce commencing shortly after 2 o'clock. The Times went to press too early to gather any of the proceedings of the meeting, which will be published tomorrow.

Dr. Fohl, of Myrtle Point, an expert on fruit matters, and a number of the big fruit growers in the county, will speak at the meeting this afternoon. If a suitable man is available the appointment of an inspector of fruit trees for the county will probably be suggested. Discussion of the best methods of conducting orchards, and all matters pertaining to horticulture will be heard at the meeting this afternoon, which is expected to be only the first of a series of important gatherings of fruit men of the county.

Olson received as a Christmas present a gold watch and chain valued at \$250. The timepiece was sent to him from San Francisco, by George D. Gray, owner of the steamer, and the Firemen's Fund Association, the underwriters. On one side of the chain is the following inscription:

"Presented to W. B. Olson by the owners and underwriters of the steamer Alliance, November 28, 1907."

The date is that on which the craft met with the accident in crossing Coos Bay bar. Accompanying the present were laudatory letters from the donors, who stated the gift is but a small token, expressive of their appreciation for the bravery and fine seamanship of the skipper. Of late the captain has had other costly presents showered upon him by admiring friends.
