NORTH BEND IS BOOMING

Lo! In the morning when Jack arose the beanstalk, from a tiny shoot, had sprung up by magic and grown out of sight—No, this isn't a fairy tale; merely a chronicle of some few of the signs of the times in North Bend, as evidenced by the building activity. There's no fairy tale in connection, neither magic—nobody ever heard of a fairy with a union card nor a magic house requiring real hammers, nails and lumber to build. But the metaphor is good. North Bend's building era is nothing short of wonderful. To those who came here a year ago and remember the present cleared and populous additions as heavily timbered tracts the situation needs little comment. To these the story drolls when converted from the rugged reality onto paper. But old and young residents alike feel a sense of deep pride in the retelling of North Bend's march cityward. Daily, one can see material advancement.

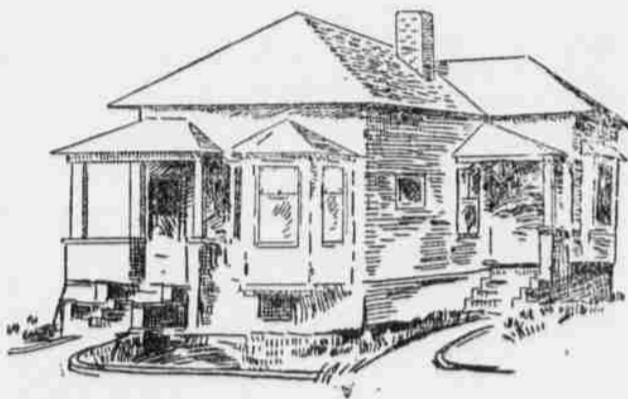
Perhaps the most vivid idea can be gained by visiting the great centrifugal force of this building movement—North Bend's waterfront mills. On the dock just above Kelly's boat landing is the North Bend Sash and Door Factory. Through this industry passes, theoretically, practically every house of consequence erected on Coos Bay; for it is the only manufactory making doors and sashes. At the present time it is running to full capacity and still hardly able to handle the orders. Sixty-five men are now at work and J. F. Bode, the manager, said Friday that he could use more labor if it were procurable. The mill is eating up every month 300,000 feet of Oregon timber. The box factory farther north on the wharf is cutting 50,000 feet of lumber daily and running night and day. Very shortly the Coos Bay Furniture factory will start again, after its short suspension for light repairs, and an additional force will be put on to fill the back orders for its output. Both the Simpson mill, at old North Bend, and the mill at Porter are running to capacity to keep up with their orders. The capacity of the North Bend mill is about 75,000 feet daily and the Porter mill about 125,000 feet daily.

Illustrative of the building now in progress in North Bend is the following list of recent construction work:

- ◆ S. Backey is erecting a store building on Virginia street.
- ◆ Mr. Graves is erecting a two-story store on Sherman avenue.
- ◆ Plans and specifications are out for a large modern two-story building to be erected near the post-office.
- ◆ George Beal, the saw mill man, is financing it. The building is to have three store rooms on the first floor while the second will be divided into about twenty-five offices.
- ◆ C. F. McCullom's handsome residence on Sherman street hill is practically completed. This is by far one of the handsomest houses erected on the bay for some time.
- ◆ Bob Simpson has just completed an elegant eleven room house on Sherman avenue near the Simpson park.
- ◆ W. B. Dilley is building a neat cottage in North Bend.
- ◆ Carl Lockdam is putting up a six-room dwelling on Sherman avenue opposite the Mercy hospital.
- ◆ There are some half dozen cottages going up on Swing Point, Bangor addition, in the vicinity of the Reynolds mill. Building has been unusually heavy around Pony Inlet for some time past.
- ◆ Thomas Vigars, North Bend's well known real estate man, is building a cottage to rent in Bangor addition.
- ◆ R. A. Wernick will soon start work on a pretty cottage in Porter addition.
- ◆ Fred Miller is now building a six-room house in the Porter addition.
- ◆ A. J. Griffith is now erecting a handsome and substantial six-room house.
- ◆ Harry Noble has just completed two fine cottages: one is on Sherman avenue near California, and the other on Union near California.
- ◆ Joe Scarth and Jake Lippold are among those who have recently built new cottages in North Bend.
