NEW ENGINE TURNED OUT AT NORTH BEND.

Gasoline Motor That is Proving Great Success.

H. R. Bevier, proprietor of the North Bend Gas Engine Works, is now turning out a new model engine that is declared by those who have seen it to excel anything now in use on the bay. It is especially devised for use in boats and launches, provision being made for casing it in a water tight compartment so that it will not be harmed by waves washing over the boat.

Mr. Bevier now has one on exhibiturned yesterday for a week outtion at his shops at the old North Bend woolen mills. Several have already been ordered and he has a large force of men busy turning them out. With the exception of a few brass parts, the engine is entirely

manufactured at home. The crank hanger runs in oil which lubricates the cylinder at the same time. A "climber" makes it possible remain for a few days visiting to have any speed from 750 to 2000 revolutions per minute by merely moving a lever, which if thrown across the center, reverses the en-

> Mr. Bevier claims that his engine will run a 14-inch propeller 200 revolutions per minute faster than any other machine of the same horsepower on the bay. He states that eastern firms in demonstrating their machines use a propeller having a low pitch in the blades which gives rapidity of motion to the wheel but

not a corresponding increase of speed. Among the ones ordered of him there are three single cylinder, one two-cylinder and one eighteen horsepower, three-cylinder engines,
