THE COMET'S DIZZY SPEED.

THE speed limit on automobiles in the city is twelve miles an hour. There are sixty minutes in an hour. Suppose an automobile were to move at the rate of twelve miles a minute—seven hundred and twenty miles an hour—that would be a giddy gait from the standpoint of the average human being. Astronomers are familiar with velocities that make this seem tame. The earth, twenty-four thousand miles in circumference, makes a complete revolution every day, which whirls everything on its surface around its axis at the rate of a thousand miles an hour. The motion of the earth around the sun is at the rate of 11 1/2 miles a minute. When Halley's comet attains its greatest speed, on the 19th of the present month, it will whizz through space at the rate of 1878 miles a minute. There is a velocity which human imagination is not trained to grasp.

The comet rushes into the vicinity of the earth at intervals of approximately seventy-five years and rushes off again in obedience to the same law of gravity which keeps the earth and all the heavenly bodies in their orbits. Motion is a great preservative. Every child is familiar with the fact that when a hoop keeps moving it will stand up and that when it stops moving it will fall down. If the heavenly bodies revolving about the sun did not keep moving they would drop into the sun. Halley's comet moves at a comparatively languid pace when at its greatest distance from the solar system, but with enormously accelerated velocity when it makes its nearest approach to the sun. This is in accordance with the law of gravity, which law at the same time draws the comet toward the sun and keeps it from falling into it.
