





## EVERY-DAY RECIPES.

## Economical Cookies,

This is a good recipe for the children's school lunch. One and one- will come out like new. half quarts flour, two heaping teaspoonfuls of baking powder, one cup of lard, one cup of sugar, one cup of currants, one-half nutmeg. Sift the baking powder with the flour, rub the sugar and lard in the flour, then mix in the currants and nutmeg. Mix to a firm dough with cold water, roll about as thick as pie crust, sprinkle with sugar and cinnamon and cut out and bake in a brisk




