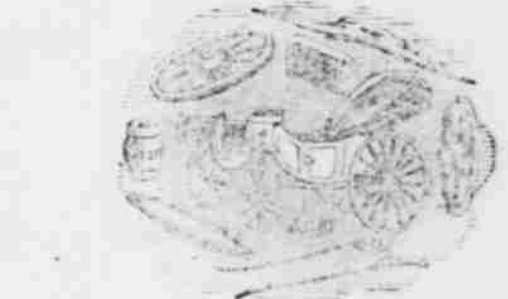

 WASHINGTON, Dec. 19. - The Senate without debate or discussion, yesterday afternoon, confirmed the nomination of Secretary McCrary to be United States Circuit Judge for the 8th Circuit.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 5.—Debate Cannon says the President's message has given a death blow to any idea of proceeding the admission of Utah as a State session. He criticises very severely the President's assertions concerning the Mormons; says he recently had several interviews with the President and disabused him or endeavored to do so of some of the prevailing notions on this subject. Cannon says there is no truth at all in the intimation that the Mormons had something to do with the recent outbreak. He urges that people are more interested in preserving the peace with the Indians than the Mormons.
