# WIRELESS SYSTEM ON **PUGET SOUND BOATS**

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Seattle, Wash., Aug. 22.—A number of Puget sound steamers and vessels running to San Francisco and Alaska

of Puget sound steamers and vessels running to San Francisco and Alaska are soon to be equipped with wireless telegraph apparatus. So far only one or two revenue cutters have been furnished with the wireless masts and sending apparatus, but their practicability has been demonstrated as well as their commercial usefulness.

The government has signified its intention of establishing signal stations at Tatoosh island. Cape Mendocino, Cape Disappointment and Cape Blanco, and further down the coast the navy department has stations at Point Reyes, Point Bonita, and on the Farralone, Gost and Mare islands.

Three vessels are scheduled to be fitted with the apparatus, the City of Pueblo, the Queen and the Umatilla. Later, when stations are placed along the southeastern coast, the vessels voyaging northward will be equipped in the same manner.

## EXIT MR. TICKET SCALPER.

Invention of New Ballroad Ticket May Put Him on the Shelf.

N. L. Shafer, advertising manager and business promoter of the Chicago Clothing company, 69-71-73 Third street, of this city, has discovered what he thinks a form of railroad ticket that will put the ticket scalper out of bust-

will put the ticket scalper out of business.

Mr. Shafer says, "I have at last perfected a transportation ticket that absolutely has no exchange value. It is not in any way complicated and can be issued by the ticket-seller or taken up by the conductor fully as rapid as the ticket in use today. My ticket can also be manufactured without extra cost." Mr. Shafer is considering selling the ticket right to some large company, or patenting the invention and controlling the right of the sale of the ticket.

The inventor further says, "I will expose my ticket to any responsible person or company under certain conditions. Of course the doubt of such a ticket is natural, almost general, but my experience has been broad. Having handled railroad tickets I believe I know exactly what the transportation companies require. My ticket has absolutely no value to a scalper, is not transferable and the most inexperienced person would not attempt to use one. To demonstrate its worth I will, under conditions, of course, expose the ticket and will give \$1,000 cash to any man, woman or child other than the right owner of the sold ticket who will ride one single division of a trip from Portland to New York; and without notification to a single bonductor of the existence of such a ticket. Any one of them would distort it. It is simplicity itself. I have been at work for over a year trying to discover this form of a ticket, and knew how simple it has to be to be of use of a railroad company.
