With a sweep that was beyond expectation and eclipsed almost all political records, Theodore Roosevelt has been elected president of the United States in the electoral college...

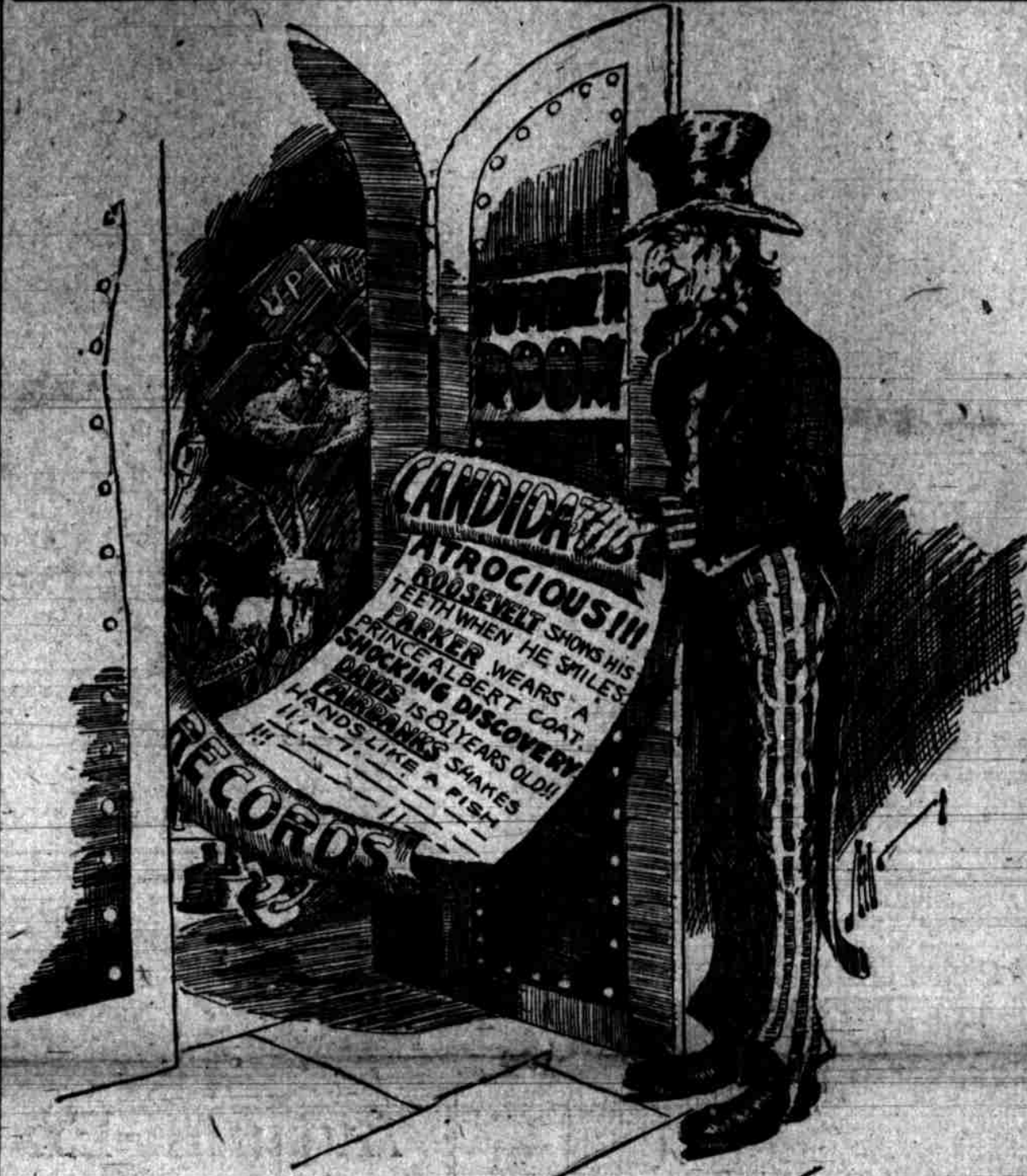

A remarkable feature of the vote in every county where prohibition was an issue was the fact that the number of votes cast for it was materially less than the number cast for local option.

PLURALITY IS 41,658

VICTORY OVERWHELMING

These are Republican Chairman Baker's Figures—Prohibition an Issue and Victorious in Some Down-State Counties.

The vote in Multnomah county yesterday gave Roosevelt a plurality of 11,273. It was even larger than was expected by leaders of that party.

Republican Estimates. Chairman Frank Baker of the Republican state central committee, estimates Roosevelt's plurality in Oregon at 41,658.

Getting the Returns. Streets in the business district were dense with people last night. Long before authentic returns began to come in the crowds were collecting and by 3 o'clock there was a restless, expectant multitude waiting patiently for the flashes that told of the election in other parts of the country.
